THE FAMILY OF TIPTON
Compiled by the Rev. Ervin Charles Tipton
of
25 Sunset Way, San Rafael, Calif.

The family of Tipton goes back to 850 A.D. to what is now the borough of Tipton in Shropshire, England. At that time it was called Tibbingas. The name implies that an Anglo-Saxon tribe by the name of Tibb or Tibba dwelt there. The name Tibb or Tibba is derived from the hunting goddess St. Tibba or Tybba. The name Tibbingas went through a number of changes through the centuries, until by 1577 it had become Tipton. In the Domesday survey of 1086 it was spelled Tibintone. (The above material was gathered by the writer from research in the library in the borough of Tipton).

Before this time the tribe of Tipton seems to have been Vikings or Norsemen who came down into Scotland around the year 850 and then into England. From Shropshire they spread to York and Staffordshire, to places like, York, Wetherby, Pontesbury, Ministerly, and Shrewshury and other places near these. There are Tiptons still living in these communities today, where the writer has been a guest in their homes.

The first Tipton we know by full name was Sir Anthony de Tipton, knighted by Edward the 1st in 1282. As in the "History and Description of the Tipton Arms" in the genealogy chart handed down by the Rev. Richard Mytton of Halston in Salop, "Formed from the Manuscripts of the Rev. John Newling, Canon Residentiary of Lichfield; of the Rev. I. B. Blakeway of Shrewsbury; and of Richard Mytton of Halston in Salop Esq. from the Heralds Visitations of the several Counties of Salop, Surrey and Derby, and also from the information of the family in 1820." From this source we have the following information: "Anthony Tipton, or Tipdown, as Fordon says, of Wetherby in Yorkshire, a man famous in the days of King Edward I, who fought against Llewellyn, Prince of Wales (this was the Welch Rebellion) and cut off his head, being then but a private soldier. He presented it to the King, who caused it to be crowned with ivy and placed on the Tower of London about the year 1283. (The battle took place at the foot of Mt. Snowden, in Wales. Here he was knighted on the field of battle by King Edward I, on Dec. 11, 1282). Anno 1286 he crossed the Sea, forsaking idleness, as Duport, a Frenchman relates, and came into the Court of Philip IVth (entitled "La belle"), where King Edward was reconciling the Kings of Sicily and Arragon. This Anthony Tipton undertook the tournament at Paris, where he vanquished Stephen d' Argentie, and took possession of his Device-which was :- a demi-lion, Argent, Gules-and appropriated it unto himself, according to the Laws of Arms, his Cognizance being that day, a Coat embroidered with the badge of England.

"Upon his return from France he married Isabella, daughter of Roger Musgrave, of Hartley Castle, in the County of Westmoreland.from this marriage sprung Edward, (after Edward the I) Henry, (after Henry II) Roger, (after his grandfather, Roger Musgrave) and Anthony, (after his father). (The marriage being about 1290). (Edward was born about 1291; Henry about 1293; Roger about 1295; and Anthony about 1297).

Anthony later gave up his title due to the expense of maintaining the prestige that went with it. "He died at York and was buried at Wetherby." (Source the same as above). The writer visited the city of York and Wetherby in 1967. The present Market Place in the town of Wetherby now stands on the spot where the old cemetery was.)

"He was buried at Wetherby with this Epitaph:

"Hic jacet corpus fortis viri Anthonii Tipton in Spe Resurrectionis. Ora pro Anima." Which reads, "Here lies the body of a brave man, Anthony Tipton, in hope of the Resurrection. Pray for his soul." (This material taken from the same source as above.)

The next in line was a son of one of the four sons mentioned above, but we do not know his name. He in turn had a son whose name is unknown, but his son was William Tipton, born about 1360 and m. about 1384. We do not know the name of his wife, but he had a son John Tipton born about 1385 and married about 1409, wife unknown, but his son was William, born about 1410. His wife is unknown, but his son was named John about 1435, wife unknown and they had a son William. This William was born about 1460 and married Margery, the daughter of and heir of William Hodges of Pontesbury, Co. of Salop, 1480. (This Tipton Pedigree was taken from records taken by the Rev. I. B. Blakeway of St. Mary's, Shrewsbury, and from the mss. of the Rev. Mytton of Salop, and passed down to Mrs. Lydia (Stubbs) Tipton of Hazelmere, England, by her cousin, the Bishop of Swansea Brecon.)

The son of William Tipton and Margery Hodges was Thomas, born about 1500. He married the daughter and heir of the Hancochs of Condoover, Com. of Salop, at Hanwood about 1541, wifes name unknown at this writing. His son was Edward Tipton.

Samuel Tipton, a merchant of Bristol, and descendant of this line was born in 1600 and died in 1684, wife unknown. His son Edward was the first Tipton to come to America. He came to Baltimore, Maryland on the ship "Friendship" in 1668 from London. (Bk.11 Folio 379 Immigration records in Balitmore.) His first wife was Elizabeth _____. His second wife was Margaret Downing, widow of Captian William Downing. "From him descended a great line of fighters and pioneers." (See Heineman, Washington Post, Dec. 23, 1934).

This Edward was the father of Jonathan, born on Jamacia in about 1660, and died in 1757. Some say he was born in 1639, but this would be before the English took the Island over in 1655, and would make him 118 at the time of his death. At the time of his death he is listed as being 118 according to the Maryland Gazette of Baltimore, Jan. 27, 1757, Col. 2 p. 3. but it seems now that some mistake must have been made in view of the foregoing.

The rest of this genealogy continues on the following pages.

P.S. The writer made a trip to Hartley Castle where Sir Anthony de Tipton got his bride, the fair Isabella, the daughter of Roger Musgrave. All that is left is a pile of ruins. It stood on a promintory overlooking the village below. Most of the stones of the old castle now make up the stones of a dairy farm on the spot where it once stood. The old dungeon and a pile of old stones is all that remains in the original state.

The Rev. John Franklin Tipton, was a Baptist minister in Mo. and Oklahoma, as well as a farmer. He was always "Uncle Frank" to the writer. During the total eclipse of the sun in 1883, Uncle Frank and another man had to crawl ahead of their horses to find their way home, it was so dark.

Additional information needs here, to be added re: Jabez Murray Tipton #64. This branch of the family have often spelled it Murry. Shortly after Jabez married Elizabeth Mitchell, he with his family and his father John Tipton #63, started to move to Kentucky, but the Indians were so threatening they had to move back or turn back to Maryland. It was not long however, before they were again on their way to Kentucky., with the three boys by Rebecca, his new wife and his father John. They went by wagon, from Maryland to Pittsburg, Penn- sylvania, thence down the Ohio River to Limestone, (now Maysville) then overland by wagon to Lexington, where for a short time they lived in a log cabin, on the grounds occupied in 1882, by large store- house of Appleton and Lancaster. In a few months they moved to Madison Co. Kentucky, while Daniel Boone still lived there, in fact Jabez had land on Otter Creek, next to Bonesboro, Ky. His closest neighbor was General Greene Clay, under whom several of his sons served in the War of 1812.

Jabez' grandfather, Thomas Tipton #62, signed the "Oath of Alleg- iance" in 1776, his father John Tipton #63, signed the "Oath of All- egiance" in Baltimore Co. Maryland, on Feb. 8, 1778, and he himself signed the "Oath of Allegiance" in Baltimore Co. Maryland on Feb. 28, 1788.

This was The Patriots Oath: "I do swear I do not hold myself bound to yeild any allegiance to the King of Great Britian, his heirs or successors, and that I will be true and faithful to the State of Mary- land, and will to the utmost of my power, support and maintain, and defend the Freedom and Independance thereof, and the Governments est- ablished, against all open enemies and secret traitorous conspiracies, and will use my utmost endeavors to disclose and make known to the Governor, or some of the Judges, or Justices, all treasons, or trait- orous conspiraces, attempts or combinations, against this State or the Government thereof, which may come to my knowledge. So help me God."

This makes all descendants of Jabez Murray Tipton eligible for membership in the Sons or Daughters of the American Revolutionary War. (D.A.R.).
